

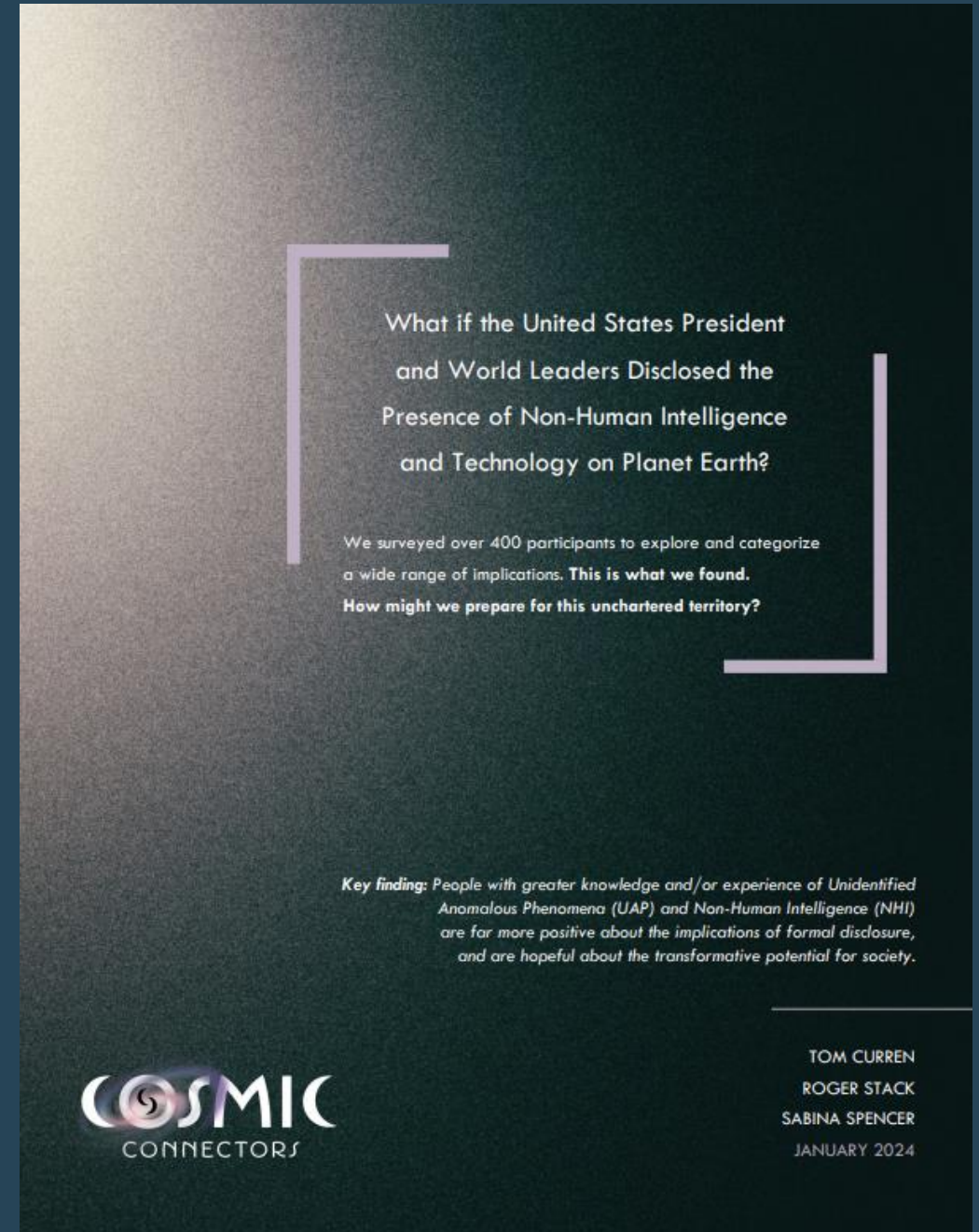
**How are people thinking and

non-human intelligences (NHI)?**

This work builds on an initial survey report finding that people who self-assess that they know more about NHI are more positive about the implications of disclosure



PROJECT PURPOSE

Identify effective ways to communicate with those not currently involved with the UAP/UFO/NHI phenomena

- Current thoughts and feelings about the prospect of contact
- Personal emotional connections
- Engagement drivers

Conducted qualitative semi-structured interviews focused on:

- Basis for interest
- Hopes and fears
- Personal and societal implications
- Burden of proof for NHI existence
- Disclosure preparation and adaptation



DEMOGRAPHICS

Sample size = 39 people

Male = 17, Female = 22

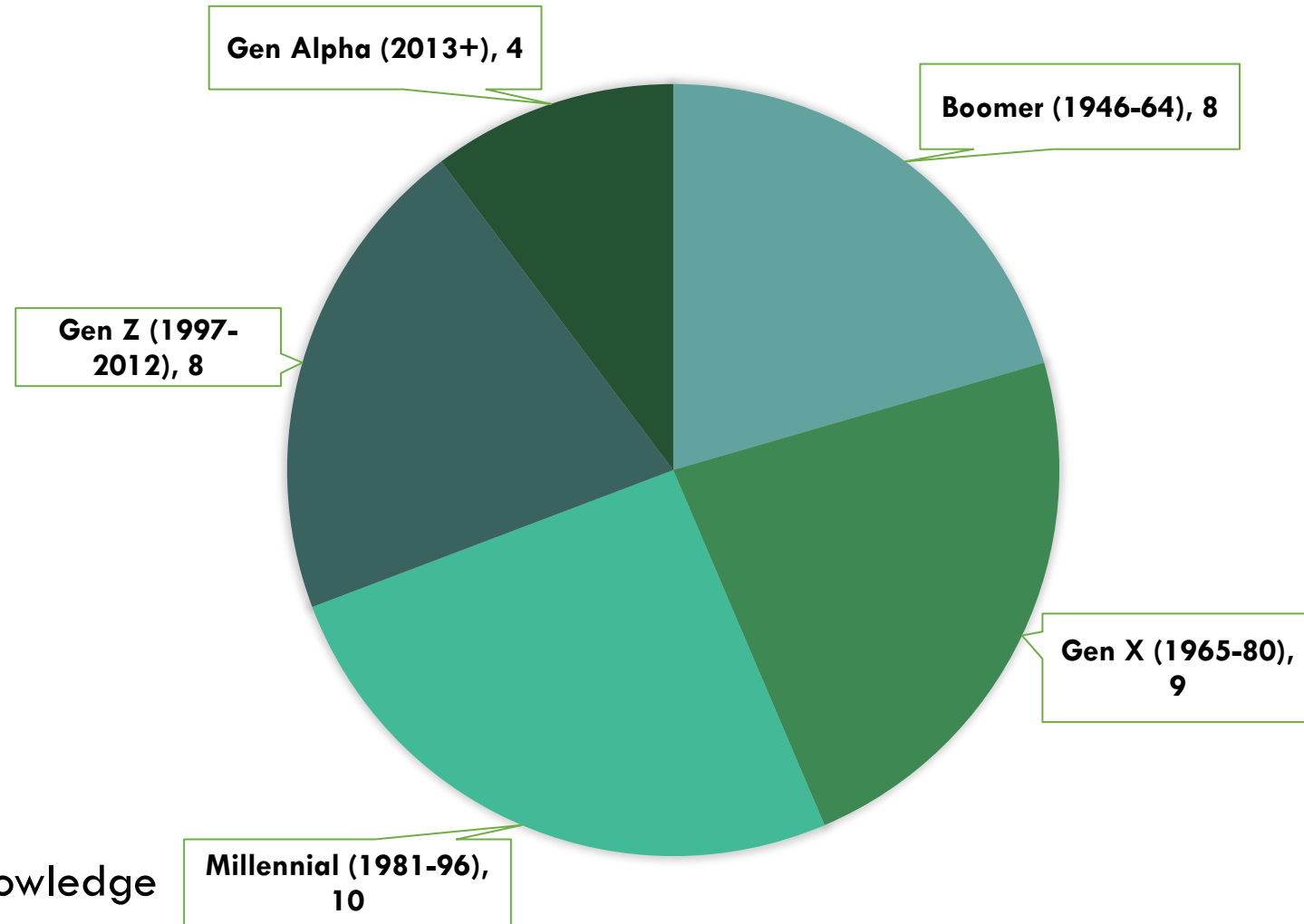
Geographic concentration

- USA – 34
- UK – 3
- Australia – 1
- Canada - 1

Excluded people at the extremes

- no interest or strong fear re: the topic
- heavy engagement and advanced knowledge

THE BELIEF PARADOX

- Belief in NHI existence is widespread and casual ("of course we're not alone")
- Yet confirmation of this belief is seen as potentially destabilizing
- Fear centers not on NHI but on human institutional and societal response
- Many express personal readiness while doubting collective readiness
- Desire for disclosure exists alongside preference for careful, gradual revelation
- Preference for progressive disclosure contrasts with catalytic standards of evidence (e.g. undeniable mass sighting)



WHAT IT TAKES TO CONVINCE INDIVIDUAL

Personal Acceptance Requires:

- Direct personal experience or accounts from trusted friends/family
- Military/pilot testimony carries weight
- Scientific validation from respected institutions
- Multiple independent confirmations

But Many Note:

- Photos/videos alone not convincing due to manipulation potential
- Government statements alone insufficient due to trust deficit
- Single evidence type rarely enough - need multiple forms



CONVINCING SOCIETY REQUIRES MORE

What Would Create Widespread Acceptance:

- Mass public sighting/event that is widely witnessed and corroborated
- Physical evidence verified by multiple trusted sources
- Scientific consensus across international institutions
- Official acknowledgment with full supporting data

Key Trust Factors:

- Source credibility more important than evidence type
- International cooperation preferred over single nation claims
- Transparency throughout verification process
- Independent scientific confirmation essential
- Public access to relevant data



GREATEST HOPES - COLLECTIVE

- Access to advanced technology that benefits humanity
- Solutions to environmental problems and Earth restoration
- Medical/health breakthroughs
- Unity among humanity and dissolution of perceived differences
- World peace/end to conflict
- Spiritual/consciousness evolution
- Space travel and cooperation with other civilizations



GREATEST HOPES - PERSONAL

- Re-evaluation of life's purpose and meaning
- Expanded consciousness and understanding of reality
- Development of latent human capabilities and psychic development
- Validation of divergent beliefs or mysterious experiences
- Understanding other ways of living/being
- New fields of study and chance to work with advanced technology



GREATEST FEAR IS US NOT THEM

Leadership & Control Issues

- Distrust in those managing contact and speaking for humanity
- Fear of information manipulation
- Deepening rather than healing divisions

Societal Disruption

- Economic/market instability
- Religious/ideological conflicts
- Social unrest/panic
- Competition over new technology

Lost Opportunity

- Mishandling first contact with aggressive human response
- Missing benefits due to poor decisions



KEY TENSIONS

Hope vs. Fear

- Optimism for positive transformation alongside worry about human response
- Excitement about possibilities vs. anxiety about real-world implementation

Trust vs. Skepticism

- Need for authoritative proof while doubting and distrusting authorities

Change vs. Stability

- Hope for transformative benefits while fearing disruption

Pragmatic vs. Profound

- Assumption of minimal daily changes while confronting deep existential questions

Personal vs. Collective Readiness

- Perceived personal ability to handle truth vs. societal capacity to adapt and cope



COMMUNICATIONS STRATEGY

Progressive Disclosure Preferred

- Gradual release of information
- Allow time for adaptation to avoid shock/major disruption
- Currently happening organically

Essential Elements

- Transparency throughout
- Multiple trusted sources with independent verification
- International cooperation and respect for diverse perspectives
- Two-way dialogue and local community engagement
- Balanced messages of hope and concern, including fear of NHI



VARIED MESSAGING TACTICS

- Younger generations - More open to messages emphasizing excitement, discovery, and future possibilities
- Older generations - May respond better to messages that address safety and stability concerns and implications for future generations
- Higher interest levels - May prefer more detailed, scientifically-oriented messages
- Spiritual or metaphysical interests - May be more receptive to messages about consciousness expansion and spiritual growth



SUPPORT SYSTEMS NEEDED

- Educational resources including integration into curriculum
- Mental health and trauma support
- Community discussion forums
- Expert guidance from trusted voices
- Organizational and leadership support
- Reshaping and reimagining of governance globally
- Economic stability and financial continuity planning
- Religious/cultural outreach



CAPACITY BUILDING AS POTENTIAL PATH FORWARD

- Focus on education and preparation
- Build trusted information networks
- Create support systems for processing transformational change
- Foster positive vision while acknowledging fears and concerns
- Promote inclusive, collaborative approach, including NHI
- Empower individual engagement and personal preparedness
- Demand transparency, accountability, and integrity from leadership and institutions
